1 GENERAL RULES FOR COMPETITIONS

- 1.1 Any member wishing to enter a club competition shall enter their name on the entry list and pay the appropriate entry fee and meal costs where applicable, by the closing date.
Any member/s (singles, pairs or teams) not paying the correct monies by the closing date for entries will be excluded from the competition.
- 1.2 Certain Club Board competitions can only be entered if the member has **played in four monthly medals or stableford stroke play competitions, two of which must be medal competitions in the 12 months preceding the closing date for the competition.** Under this rule non-return/disqualified cards will not count under the eligibility criteria.
- 1.3 Handicap restrictions are detailed in the rules for each competition where these apply.
- 1.4 If a player does not turn up for a competition, including monthly medals and stablefords, and no valid reason has been given, they will **not be allowed to enter the next three competitions** including medals and stablefords. It is important therefore, that non-availability is reported as follows:
- **monthly medals/stablefords:** the Pro Shop must be informed as soon as possible.
 - **club competitions:** the Competition Secretary must be informed.
- 1.5 Where a club board competition includes a meal it is an integral part of that competition therefore if you cannot attend the meal you cannot enter the competition.
- 1.6 Trophies are the property of Lakeside Lodge Golf Club and are not to be taken away from the Club House; mementos will however be presented to the winners.
- 1.7 In the event of a tie in a competition, the following will apply:
- 1.7.1 Medal/Stableford: count back in accordance with the Rules of Golf will apply to determine the winner.*
- The best back nine will apply.
 - Where the tie remains the same, the organising committee will refer to the best six holes and then the best three holes and finally the 18th hole.
 - In a multiple tee start, the last nine holes are considered to be holes 10-18, 13-18 etc. If there is still a tie, the same count back provisions will be applied to the front nine holes.

1.7.2 Match play: Sudden death play-off from the starting hole. In a handicap match, handicap strokes should be allowed as in the stipulated round

- 1.8 Competitions where stated qualify for handicap purposes unless on the day either two or more temporary greens or one temporary tee are in play
- 1.9 The use of buggies in any qualifying competitions is not generally allowed. However, in exceptional circumstances Buggies may be used if permission has been granted in writing by the Committee in advance of the competition. **Buggies will not be allowed during the Club Championships under any circumstances.**
- 1.10 Club members who believe that they have been unable to achieve the eligibility criteria for entry into a competition because of a significant, long term illness or injury may seek to have their position reviewed by the committee. Such applications are to be made in writing to the Club Captain and members should be aware that a supporting medical certificate might be required.
- 1.11 Club members who believe that they have been unable to achieve the eligibility criteria for entry into a competition because of selection for National and/or County level sports commitments, either representative or training, may seek to have their position reviewed by the committee. Such applications are to be made in writing to the Club Captain accompanied by supporting documentary evidence from the sports body concerned.
- 1.12 In the event of inclement weather the following protocol will apply to all Club Competitions, (single day events):
- 1.12.1 18 Hole Competitions with Single Tee Start: the organising committee will decide which of the following options will apply.*
- (i) *Option 1:* Suspend play until the weather improves and restart the competition and play to a conclusion over all 18 holes.
- (ii) *Option2:* Abandon the competition if the weather fails to improve. In the event of option 2, there are two further sub-options.
- (a) *Option 2.1:* If no player has completed 9 holes by the time the play is abandoned, declare the competition null and void with the possibility of rescheduling it or refunding the entry fee.
- (b) *Option 2.2:* If all players have completed 9 or more holes by the time play is abandoned, declare a result on the basis of the number of holes that ALL players have completed.
- 1.12.2 18 Hole Competition: two tee start*
- As above except that there cannot be an overall result, instead there will have to be two sets of results, one for those commencing on the front nine and the other for those commencing on the back nine.

Additional points

- All players must be advised that in the event of play being suspended on grounds of inclement weather, they should mark their ball as it lies and find a place of safety.
- In the event of there being a match meal after the competition, this will normally proceed as planned [no refunds], unless the competition is abandoned before any player commences the competition in which case the meal will be cancelled and the meal price refunded.

1.13 **Distance Measuring Devices (DMDs)**: The Committee have decided that the use of DMDs is permitted in all LLGC competitions with effect from 1 Jan 2010.

1.14 **Pace of play**: Players should play at a good pace. The Committee has determined that a 4-ball round on the Lodge Course should take no longer than 4 ½ hours. It is a group's responsibility to keep up with the group in front. If it loses a clear hole and it is delaying the group behind, it should invite the group behind to play through, irrespective of the number of players in that group. Where a group has not lost a clear hole, but it is apparent that the group behind can play faster, it should invite the faster moving group to play through.

18 RULES FOR THE SINGLES AND PAIRS KNOCKOUT

- 18.1 All members wishing to enter the competitions shall enter their names on the entry sheet and pay the appropriate fee per person per competition by the closing date for entry.
- 18.2 Members must have completed 4 Lakeside Lodge Monthly stroke play competitions (including 2 medals) in the 12 months preceding the closing date, both members of the pair must meet this criterion; cards must have been handed in for handicap purposes. Any member or pair not meeting the eligibility criteria or not paying the correct fee by the closing date will be excluded from the draw.
- 18.3 Each round will have a cut off date for completion by which time all matches must be played. **EXTENSIONS WILL NOT BE GRANTED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES** (see 18.7 below)
- 18.4 It is the responsibility of all players to be aware of the rules of the competitions.
- 18.5 All matches must be played to a conclusion. If the match remains all-square after 18 holes, the match will continue from the 1st hole on the basis of sudden death. Handicap strokes should be allowed as in the stipulated round
- 18.6 **It is the joint responsibility of all the players concerned to arrange a suitable date for their particular match. Player/Pair A should make the first contact but Player/Pair B must also act responsibly in helping to arrange match dates.**
- 18.7 If a suitable date cannot be agreed upon, to maintain the flow and timing of the competition, a winner should be decided by the toss of a coin.
- 18.8 In the event that the winners name is not entered for a particular match by the closing date of that round, then both parties shall be eliminated from the competition and a bye awarded to the next opponent(s).
- 18.9 Players should be aware of the final dates for the matches and endeavour to play them well in advance. They do not have to wait for the previous round to be completed before playing a match in a later round.
- 18.10 The finals of the ladies competitions will be played over 18 holes; the finals of the gentlemen's pairs and singles competitions will be played over 36 consecutive holes.
- 18.11 Substitution is allowed by agreement with the Competitions Secretary before the commencement of the 1st round.

- 20.1 All members wishing to enter the competitions shall enter their names on the entry sheet and pay the appropriate fee per person per competition by the closing date for entry.
- 20.2 Members must have completed 4 Lakeside Lodge Monthly stroke play competitions (including 2 medals) in the 12 months preceding the closing date, both members of a pair must meet this criterion; cards must have been handed in for handicap purposes. Any member or pair not meeting the eligibility criteria or not paying the correct fee by the closing date will be excluded from the draw.
- 20.3 Each round will have a cut off date for completion by which time all matches must be played. **EXTENSIONS WILL NOT BE GRANTED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES** (see 20.7 below)
- 20.4 It is the responsibility of all players to be aware of the rules of the competitions.
- 20.5 All matches must be played to a conclusion. If the match remains all-square after 18 holes, the match will continue from the 1st hole on the basis of sudden death. Handicap strokes should be allowed as in the stipulated round**
- 20.6 It is the joint responsibility of all the players concerned to arrange a suitable date for their particular match. Pair A should make the first contact but Pair B must also act responsibly in helping to arrange match dates.**
- 20.7 It is important to maintain the flow and timing of the competition. Therefore, if a suitable date cannot be agreed upon, a winner should be decided by the toss of a coin or other means
- 20.8 In the event that the winner's names are not entered for a particular match by the closing date of that round, then both parties shall be eliminated from the competition and a bye awarded to the next opponent(s).
- 20.9 Players should be aware of the final dates for the matches and endeavour to play them well in advance. They do not have to wait for the previous round to be completed before playing a match in a later round.
- 20.10 Substitution is allowed by agreement with the Competitions Secretary before the commencement of the 1st round.
